- Eat a healthy diet that includes plenty of fruits, vegetables



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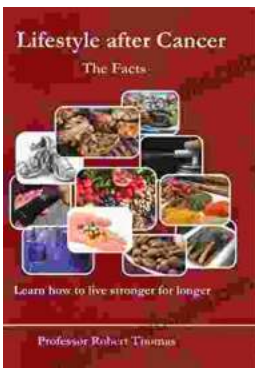
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
