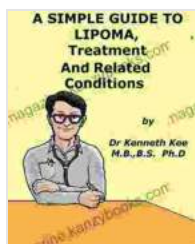

- Swelling or redness around the lipoma

3. Lipomas are rarely harmful, but a dermatologist can remove them if they bother you.

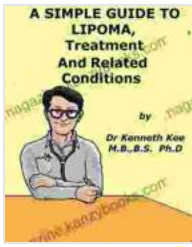
4. Lipomas are often found on the neck, shoulders, back, abdomen, arms, or thighs.

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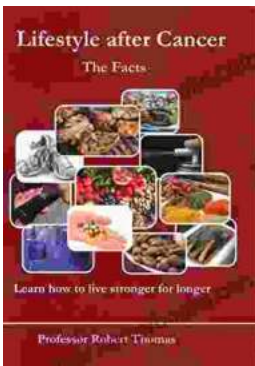
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
